TEN YEAR CELEBRATION

On Sunday, 21st August, at 2 pm, Cue Theatre
will celebrate ten years in the new theatre.

There will also be an unveiling of the new
frontage, now nearing completion. Designed
by Alan Stevenson, this will do much to give
the theatre a new identity and prominence.

The occasion is seen as an opportunity to
acknowledge the support of the community
and recognise the uses to which the theatre
has been put since 2001.

So what has happened?

There have been 28 Cue Theatre
productions, the work of 15 directors.

Amongst these plays were 2 with young
people, historical dramas, comedies, New
Zealand, American and English writers, and a
locally written musical.

In addition, we had the Central Regional
Festival of Community Drama hosting groups
from the lower North Island

Then there were professional actors doing 1-3
night seasons. We remember nationally
known actors, such as Helen Moulder, Jane

Waddell and Ray Henwood, as well as
Taranaki Arts Festival and the Howick Players

Music has been an important feature with
concerts involving some or all of the following

Harmony Singers with Elaine Schreiber,
Krystal Tofts and Kevin Koch. The Taranaki

Music Teachers have used the theatre
regularly for concerts with their students and
recently the Secondary Schools Competition
for Chamber Music Groups was staged here.

The foyer has been the venue for regular
exhibitions, notably by the Inglewood
Photograph Appreciation Group and
Artizone, a group of New Plymouth women
artists
