It will be a theme dinner, an entertainment which proved so popular with our production of “Allo. Allo ” last year.

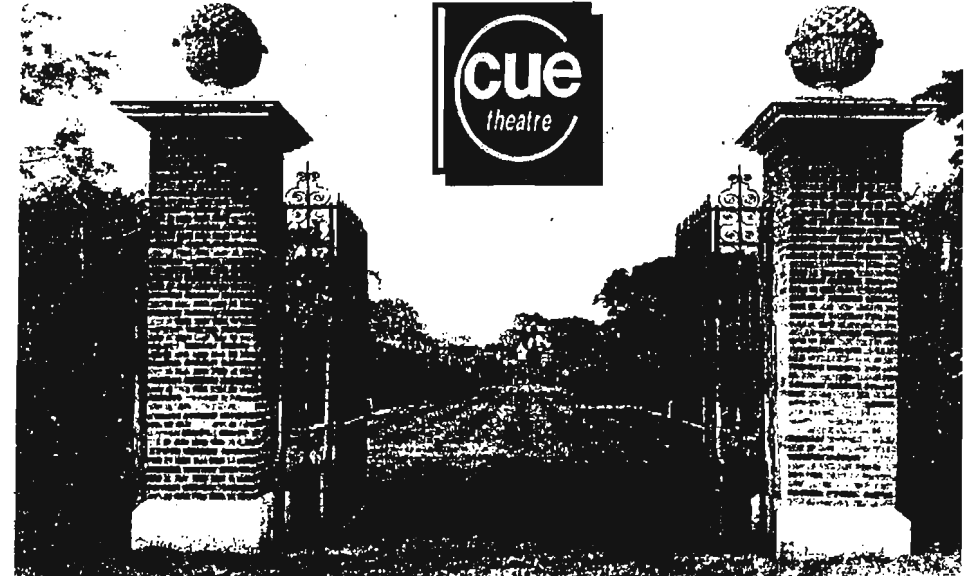
