

What is a play?

It is the re-creation of events as seen by the playwright, producer and players. The dialogue is supplied by the playwright, and the producer and players work to present this as dramatically effectively as possible.

The style of dialogue varies considerably, ranging from poetic Shakespeare to prosaic Shaw. In all, we are fairly easily persuaded that this is how the characters actually talked.

However, recent years have seen increasing interest from professors and playwrights alike in the patterns of everyday speech. More and more scripts are becoming available which capture more natural dialogue.

While this is acceptable as a vehicle for comedy, will it serve also for tragedy? Can the attention of an audience be held with the lacklustre phrases of everyday speech?

If, in addition, the dramatist calls for a set devoid of the usual bric-a-brac and provides an action with none of the traditional business involving cigarette lighters, telephones, etc, it will be obvious that he has faith in his script to achieve its purpose.

And what of the characters? Who are they? What have they done before? When people meet as strangers, do they always tell the truth about themselves?

These are some of the considerations which influenced the choice of this play for the Society's current production. We hope that you, too, will find it has interest.
