Shadowlands:

William Nicholson's stage adaptation of his award-winning TV play relates the story of shy Oxford don and children's author C S Lewis and American poet Joy Davidman Gresham. Their relationship starts as an exchange of literary correspondence. During a trip to England in search of a publisher, Gresham asks Lewis to meet her. He and his brother accept.

When Joy arrives in Oxford her intellectual assertiveness delights Lewis but appalls his condescending fellow academics. They are further shocked when Lewis goes through a marriage of convenience with her for immigration purposes.

From tentative, timid beginnings, their friendship develops into a deep, abiding love and sets them on a path that ultimately challenges Lewis' previously unshakeable belief in a kind and loving God.

The setting is Oxford - in the 1950s.
